## A Message from Pastor Scott...



### An Opportunity to say "Thank You"

As I've said before, I've never served a congregation as committed to caring for their Seniors than Westminster. Our Deacons are each assigned a shut-in. They make regular communications with their shut-in and make personal visits, as well. I am touched by how often I go to visit a shut-in at the hospital and the person requests that I call their Deacon. In those moments when there is a death, I almost always see the deceased person's Deacon at the funeral, continuing their call by offering support to the family. It is not unusual for Deacons, who are no longer on the board, to continue going to visit their shut-in because their friendships have become so deep.

Along with Deacon care, we have the blessing of three individuals in our congregation who give so much of themselves in providing ongoing care and offering the sacrament of Holy Communion. Rev. Dick Kiefer, Linda Blair and Jan Bannister make regular visits to our shut-ins and keep up with their lives and spiritual needs. These three are also great communicators, sharing information with the pastors and the Board of Deacons, so we can remain regularly informed of a person's needs.

Our congregation is also blessed with Rev. Ken Arentson's continued pastoral care. Ken volunteers part time making hospital visits, performing some funerals, and responding to other pastoral issues that arise. His knowledge of the church's families and their histories makes him an invaluable resource. But most of all, his wisdom, faith, and compassion allows him to care in a uniquely meaningful way.

Finally, I am grateful for all of you. I cannot count the number of times members of our church family have come up to me, just to make sure I know about someone's particular situation. Your love and concern for one another is moving. Please continue to watch out for one another. Get to know the people you sit near in

worship. If they've been missing for a few weeks, ask around and make sure that all is well. Also, let me know if someone you know is hospitalized or struggling in any way. Never assume we know everyone's situation. I would much rather be told ten times about someone, than miss an opportunity to offer care.

The ministry provided by those mentioned by name, and so many other members of our church, is an inspiration. Those I've mentioned today are a blessing, but they are not uniquely qualified to care. Any one of us can be a blessing - it just takes a little time and compassion. Even if you are not at a place where you can make visits, you can take a little time each day and offer prayers. It is as easy as going through the church directory. Go through the directory, and each day pray for two or three individuals or families. Your prayers can make a lasting difference.

Thank you, one and all, for the ways you offer care!


### Sarah Nelson

### Briar Conrey



# GOD'S GARDEN REFUGEE GARDEN PLOTS

### A Collaboration of Westminster Presbyterian Church and Lutheran Services in Iowa

The Social Justice Committee and the God's Garden Team are excited to announce that God's Garden is relocating and expanding! The new garden will be located in the north parking lot and will be a partnership with Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI). The space will provide small community garden plots for 19 refugee families near their homes. Community gardening helps support refugee assimilation and stabilizes refugee families by reconnecting farmers with the land as they build their new life in the U.S.

After one year in LSI's community garden program, farmers are eligible to participate in the Global Greens program. The Global Greens farm, shown in pictures on the next page, is located behind Valley Community Center in West Des Moines. In this program, farmers can

learn more about U.S. agriculture and start their own business by selling produce at LSI's Farmers' Market and in LSI's Community Supported Agriculture Program (CSA).

Construction on the garden began in April with asphalt removal in the back part of the north parking lot. If all goes according to plan, we anticipate that families can begin planting at the end of May.

We need your help to make this exciting mission happen! There will be several opportunities this spring to help with this exciting mission.

Two Work Saturdays have been scheduled for May 5 and May 19 from 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Volunteers of all skill levels are welcome. Jobs will include spreading and mixing soil, moving and organizing sheds, building garden beds and paths,

laying down weed barrier, mulching paths, and much more!

If you are unable to help during the work days, you can still pitch-in. There will be several opportunities to donate garden supplies. Please keep an eye out for requests in upcoming E-blasts and bulletin inserts.

We would like to thank Jeff Geerts for the countless hours he has worked to make this project happen. We would also like to thank the City of Des Moines for donating the soil for the garden, Central Iowa Fencing for providing fencing materials at cost, and to Josh Hays for agreeing to install the fence at no cost to Westminster.




### TRIVIA NIGHT A SUCCESS!
